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# SYSTEMATIC LITERATURE REVIEW (SLR):

# THE ROLE OF LEARNING COMMUNITIES IN THE FORMATION OF CHILDREN'S CHARACTER THROUGH CHILDREN'S EDUCATION BASED ON HABITUTION METHODS

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#### **ABSTRACT**

Early childhood education plays a significant role in shaping children's holistic development. Empowering learning communities has been recognized as an effective strategy in strengthening the initial foundations of early childhood education. This article uses the Systematic Literature Review (SLR) research method to explore the practice of empowering learning communities in early childhood education. Findings from SLR show that collaboration between parents, teachers, government and local communities can create a supportive learning environment for young children. Through analysis of existing literature, this article provides insight into how empowering learning communities can be an effective strategy in building a strong initial foundation for Early Childhood Education.

#### INTRODUCTION

At an early age, children experience significant progress in various aspects, such as fine and gross motor skills, thinking, creativity, and language and communication. They also show





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development in various types of intelligence, such as intellectual (IQ), emotional (EQ), spiritual (SQ), or religious (RQ), according to their stage of development. The importance of providing guidance and direction during this period is to facilitate the building of a strong foundation for holistic human growth and development. The learning process in early childhood should aim to present basic concepts that are meaningful to them through real experiences that enable them to explore their activities and curiosity optimally. (Ariyanti. 2016)

Based on the provisions of Constitution Number 20 of 2003, Early Childhood Education (PAUD) refers to coaching efforts provided to children from birth to 6 years of age through various types of educational stimulation. The main goal is to support children's physical and spiritual growth so that they are ready to participate in further education. Article 9 paragraph 1 of the Law emphasizes the right of every child to receive education in accordance with their personal development, interests and talents. PAUD is considered important because: 1) early childhood is a sensitive period with rapid physical, motoric, intellectual and social growth, 2) most of a person's intelligence variability occurs in early childhood (the first 4 years), 3) early childhood is a crucial phase in establishing the basis for a child's growth and development.

The role of PAUD is very important in forming human character as a whole. The main goal of early childhood education is to develop positive character, high morality, intelligence, happiness, skills and strong spirituality. The early childhood education process can start either from the family environment or through educational efforts provided by family members. According to the regulations governing early childhood education, attention given to character formation is the main focus in building national civilization. Regarding character formation from an early age, it is considered a very important step because Currently, children are going through an important period in their development. Character education that starts from an early age has a significant and sustainable impact in shaping children's personalities, providing a strong foundation for their future development.

Learning communities are the right environment to shape the character of young children. By participating in social interactions with peers and adults who are active in the community, children have the opportunity to internalize social values, improve their social skills, and foster mutually supportive and positive relationships. In the learning community, children are also given the opportunity to take part in

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various activities that support character formation, including arts, sports and social activities. Empowerment, at its core, involves giving strength or ability to vulnerable or weak individuals or groups, so that they can meet basic needs, improve economic well-being, and be involved in development processes and decision-making that affect them. This means giving them greater freedom, not only freedom of expression, but also freedom from poverty, ignorance and suffering.

Empowerment programs must be designed differently from other programs which may be authoritarian or sudden in overcoming poverty. Evaluation of empowerment programs requires a special methodology, which takes into account participatory dynamics, achieving success in meeting basic needs, increasing access to productive resources, and the level of involvement in the decision process. Thus, the evaluation approach must be more holistic and consider contextual factors and the long-term sustainability of the empowerment. (Ajeng. 2023)

The formation of a child's character should start in the family environment because this is where children first interact with other people. Character education should start from an early age because at that stage, children are very influenced by their surrounding environment. Apart from that, schools also play an important role in shaping children's character because of the significant role that teachers have in this process. Therefore, close collaboration between families, schools and communities is very important to provide holistic character education to children.

The main focus of education is to shape the human personality as a whole, which includes intellectual, emotional and spiritual aspects. As an institution, schools are morally responsible for guiding





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children to reach the level of intelligence expected by parents and society. The role of teachers in this process is crucial because they not only serve as teachers, but also as educators who shape character and morals, children. Ulwan's opinion (1995) supports this by stating that habituation is a very appropriate method in early childhood education because children tend to be more responsive to teaching and habituation at this time compared to other ages. During this period, children naturally gain knowledge through playing activities and exploring the environment around them. Effective early childhood education aims to support this learning process by creating a stimulating environment, providing substantial experiences, and promoting healthy social interactions. Apart from that, early childhood education also plays an important role in enriching their social skills, critical thinking abilities, creativity and increasing their independence. By providing a solid foundation in the early stages of life, early childhood education plays a central role in forming individuals who are strong and ready to face the challenges of the future.

The importance of early childhood education is also related to preventing developmental problems that may arise later in life. By paying appropriate attention to the early stages of development, we can identify and overcome developmental barriers more efficiently.

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Therefore, early childhood education is not only about conveying academic knowledge, but also about forming individuals comprehensively, who are ready to face a successful and sustainable future. This method recognizes children's overall growth, including physical, emotional, social and cognitive aspects, with the aim that they can become independent individuals and have a positive impact in their social environment.

In this environment, children have the opportunity to interact with peers and adults who are skilled in applying habituation methods. Through these interactions, children can learn directly from experience and observation, allowing them to develop the skills and knowledge necessary for their development. In this way, learning communities create a solid foundation for children's growth towards independence and positive contributions in society. (2). Becoming a Model of Positive Behavior: Members of the learning community, including parents, teachers and other community members, act as models of positive behavior for children. They show examples of excellence in various aspects of daily life, such as tolerance, caring, honesty and hard work. By seeing and imitating these behaviors, children learn to internalize these values in their characters. (3). By incorporating religious values into daily activities, learning communities give children the opportunity to absorb and make these values part of who they are. Through various learning activities that are aligned with the habituation method, children not only learn about ethics and morality, but also develop attitudes that are valued in the religious beliefs they adhere to. This gives them a deep understanding of religious principles and enables them to apply them in their daily lives with full awareness. (4). Providing social and emotional support is one of the key roles of learning communities, where children are provided with meaningful support for their development. They learn the importance of cooperation, effective communication, and positive conflict resolution through interactions with community members (5). Promoting Collaboration and Exchange of Experiences, Learning communities provide opportunities for parents and other caregivers to share experiences, knowledge and strategies in educating early childhood children based on habituation methods. This enriches parents' understanding and skills in supporting children's character development.

Early childhood education has a huge positive effect on children's growth. The following are some important positive impacts of early childhood education:





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- 1. #### RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

This study implements the Systematic Literature Review (SLR) technique, a structured, explicit and accountable method for recognizing, assessing and combining research results and conceptions related to certain objectives. The specific aim is to explore the importance of pre-school education and the function of learning communities in forming a strong initial foundation.

The research process began by formulating a clear research question: "How important is early childhood education and what is the role of learning communities in forming a strong early foundation?"

Furthermore, the research focus is aimed at journals that focus on the importance of early childhood education, using relevant keywords such as empowerment, learning community, early childhood, early foundations, collaboration, and child development. The literature study search was carried out via Google Scholar by limiting the time period from 2012 to 2024.

After collecting suitable articles, a careful selection process was carried out. From the 80 articles collected, 10 articles were selected that were most relevant to the research topic. These articles were then studied in depth, and from there, 6 articles that best suited the material for early childhood education were selected to be included in the analysis. The remaining 70 articles did not meet the inclusion criteria or were not relevant to the research objectives.

Through the flow diagram of the article inclusion and exclusion process, it can be seen that the selection process is carried out systematically and transparently, so that ensuring the selected articles are the most relevant and in accordance with the research objectives is a priority. This helps ensure that the research results have a solid basis and can be relied upon in answering the research questions asked.

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


Figure 1. Flow diagram related to the Systematic Literature Review Steps

From the research results, it is proven that applying the habituation method has succeeded in increasing the level of independence of young children. Of the total of 12 students observed, 2 of them achieved an excellent assessment in their development, 8 others showed development as expected, while 2 other students began to show progress. Creative Approach to Learning, Creative and fun learning methods, such as the FUN play model or painting art activities in the Sobat Kecil Semarang learning park community, show that a fun approach can be the key to success in the early childhood learning process. This approach not only enriches children's learning experiences, but also strengthens their engagement in learning.
- 5. The Importance of Awareness of PAUD. Efforts to increase awareness of the importance of early childhood education and the role of learning communities are very important in building a strong foundation for future generations. Collaboration between various parties in providing quality education for early childhood is an important investment in building a better future for society and the nation as a whole.

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
