# The Importance of Student Learning Styles in Determining Learning Strategies

#### ABSTRAK

This was also explained by Nasution (2003:39) who explained that learning style is a consistent way used by a student in capturing stimulus or information, how to remember or think and solve problems. Therefore, as a teacher you must be able to determine a learning style that suits your students so that teaching and learning activities can run well. Apart from that, knowing students' learning styles can also make it easier for teachers to determine what learning strategies are suitable for use in class. Learning strategies that are suitable for students can make the teaching and learning process easier and suit the characteristics of each student.

Learning strategies are ways or methods applied by a teacher to students to produce lasting changes in cognitive, emotional and motoric aspects. This is in line with the opinion of Dick and Carey

#### Result

#### a. Auditory Learning Style

The auditory learning style is a learning style that absorbs information most effectively through the sense of hearing (speech). Students who have this learning style are characterized by a clear voice, prefer to listen to other people talk, often monologue or mumble, don't like reading, enjoy listening to music and enjoy discussing with friends in groups. Another characteristic of children who have an auditory learning style is that when students read a book, their lips move along with pronouncing the words from the book, they speak in a structured and fluent rhythm, they have a little difficulty when they get assignments that involve visualization and students learn by listening and remembering. what is being said, not by what is seen.

Some teaching methods that are suitable for this auditory learning style are:

- Carry out learning activities using songs so that students are interested in learning,
- Invite students to read books regularly so that students get used to reading books,
- Teachers must be able to encourage students to participate in discussion groups,
- Get students used to having the courage to speak in front of their friends, for example discussing material that has been previously explained by the teacher.

## b. Visual Learning Style

Visual learning style is a learning style that relies on sight to receive information and knowledge during the learning process. Students who have this learning style prefer to see how to do something with certain signs, symbols or codes rather than having discussions with the group. Students with this learning style are characterized by having a high voice, speaking too fast and not wanting to listen to other people, having a neat appearance, often forgetting things and tending to be quiet when they are angry.

Teaching strategies that are suitable for students who have a visual learning style are:

- Create learning materials using pictures, diagrams or other forms of symbols so that students are interested when the teacher explains,
- Invite students to express their ideas in the form of pictures or writing,
- Give an overview of the material that students want to know. Invite students to imagine what is happening, not just remember the text,
- Give students study books that contain lots of illustrations and colorful pictures.

### c. Kinesthetic Learning Style

Kinesthetic learning style is a learning style that uses learning methods with lots of movement. Students with a kinesthetic learning style prefer to learn by interacting with friends or doing things around them. It is easier for them to digest something by participating directly compared to lectures or reading books. Characteristics of students with a kinesthetic learning style include having a deeper voice, using more movement, speaking more slowly, not liking to sit still for long periods of time, preferring to play games, sports and other physical activities.

Strategies or teaching methods that are suitable for students who have a kinesthetic learning style are:

- Increase practical activities in the field,
- Allow students to move around when the learning process is free, but must still be supervised by the teacher,
- Occasionally invite students to study outside the classroom so they don't get bored,
- Carry out ice breaking activities if the students' condition while studying looks bored, because the material explained by the teacher will be difficult for students to accept if they are not enthusiastic about learning.

When carrying out learning activities, it is very important to include students' learning styles in designing the learning process. After the teacher knows the students' learning styles and has had discussions with other teachers, it is hoped that the teacher can provide teaching methods that suit the students' skills and knowledge so that the material presented can be well received by the students.

By carrying out an appropriate teaching and learning process between students and educators, a quality learning process will be achieved. But we must continue to improve the quality of learning so that the quality of learning is maintained, both human resources, material resources, quality of learning and quality of graduates. Even though there are different definitions, what is meant by quality of learning is the ability of an educational institution to carry out learning optimally.

Therefore, if the teacher is explaining the material, some students focus on listening, some do not listen and others are busy wandering around and do not respond to the teacher's explanation of the material. This can be caused by different student learning styles and teacher teaching styles.

## CONCLUSIONS

Learning style is each student's unique way of digesting and processing information, which is generally divided into visual, auditory and kinesthetic. By understanding and implementing learning strategies that suit this learning style, teachers can improve student achievement and learning outcomes, making learning more quality and meaningful.
